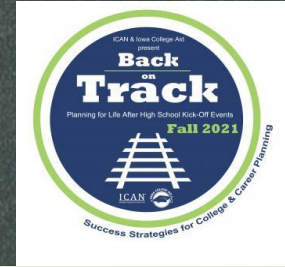

Summer Transition

SUMMER TRANSITION CHECKLIST



"Summer Melt" occurs when college-bound high school graduates fail to show up on campus in the fall of their first year of college. This happens to as many as 40 percent of college-intending students. As a College Access Coach, you will communicate via text messaging and, if needed, meet with students throughout the summer to ensure a smooth transition from high school to college. Specific tasks to complete may include:

✔ Make a budget

Review the student's financial aid award letter and pay close attention to the Cost of Attendance, which includes tuition, school fees, and room and board. Depending on the school, the award letter might or might not include books, supplies, travel and personal expenses. If these costs are not included, be sure to account for them, as well as other expenses such as health insurance, cell phone bills, etc.

✔ Create a payment timeline

When is the student's deposit (the official decision of where the student will attend school) due? The first tuition payment? Housing deposit? If needed, make a calendar with the student to keep track.

✔ Access and navigate online portals

There are online portals for everything, making processes faster and easier—if you are aware that the portals exist. Help students make a list of the different portals available to them and how to log in. Please note that the list will differ depending on what college a student is attending.

✔ Request a final transcript

The student's college might require a final official transcript to ensure that they have graduated. Request one through the high school.

✔ Register and attend orientation

Orientation allows students to meet other classmates and learn about support services on campus. At some schools, orientation is required. Even if it is not, students will get a smoother start if they attend. Some schools offer orientation for parents as well.

✔ Get required immunizations

The student's school will probably send a list of required vaccinations. Among the most common are vaccines for meningitis, tetanus/diphtheria/pertussis and HPV. If necessary, help the student schedule a visit with a family doctor or local clinic for vaccinations.

Summer transition checklist

(CONT'D)

✔ Complete housing forms

If the student plans to live on campus, make sure they know the deadline for filling out all the required housing forms and applications.

✔ Register for classes

Students who know their major should start taking basic courses in that department. Students who are not sure of a major should try out some subjects that interest them, but they should include core courses like math and composition, too. Students should spread out classes so no one day of the week is too jam-packed. Students who plan to work part-time should ask their advisors for help creating a schedule that balances employment and academics.

✔ Register for placement tests

Students might need to take placement tests in subjects like math and English to check their academic skill levels. Then the college can place each student in classes at the right level. Help students understand whether they should take placement tests and, if so, help them register.

✔ Arrange transportation

Students who plan to live on campus should think about whether they might need multiple trips to accommodate all their belongings. Students who plan to keep a car on campus will need to arrange parking permits.

✔ Address special circumstances

Some students may have special circumstances to address, such as:

- Child care needs
- Financial support to family
- Other home/family responsibilities

✔ Celebrate!

Plans are set and it is time to put them into action! Celebrate students' matriculation and, if possible, check in with them within the first weeks of college classes.
